Polly Richards: Interpretation Consultant

Profile

Training in theatre design at Nottingham Polytechnic from 1987–1990, I worked for 8 years as a freelance theatre, exhibition and film designer and gained a PhD in African art before moving into the museums and heritage sector. For the past 20 years I have worked as both a freelance interpretation and masterplanning consultant, and client side, as a permanent member of staff for major cultural heritage organisations. My unique combination of skills and expertise enables me to bridge the communication gap that often exists between academics and designers, and to envision and deliver audience-focused projects in a range of museum and heritage settings.

From 2014–2018 I was the Creative Programming and Interpretation Manager for Historic Royal Palaces, based at the Tower of London. Here I spent two years leading a large inter-departmental team and facilitating over 70 workshops with internal and external stakeholders at all levels to produce the Tower Core Story: the first Interpretation Strategy for this infamous castle. Interpretation projects at the Tower of London included the re-presentation of the Bloody and Beauchamp Towers and the redesign of the visitor map and cross-site wayfinding. I also worked with Royal Armouries to deliver Armouries in Action, a new interactive gallery for families which opened in 2017. In the same year I championed a cross-palace, cross-departmental team to deliver Palace Pride:- Historic Royal Palace's first LGBT+ programme. This included my leading the delivery of the Tower's first LGBT+ tour (May 2017) and this tour has now become embedded in both the permanent daily and commercial offer.

From 2011–2014 I was Exhibitions Interpretation Curator at the Royal Museums Greenwich where I delivered projects of all scales including a master plan study for the Royal Observatory Greenwich; interpretation for the Great Map and Neptune Court Re-display; and the interpretation for Ansel Adams: from the Mountains to the Sea, a special exhibition in the Sammy Offer Wing.

From 2005–2009 I worked at Ralph Appelbaum Associates (RAA) as Senior Content Developer on both public and private sector museums, galleries and exhibitions. Projects during this time included the re-development of the Royal Albert Memorial Museum in Exeter; a Master-plan Scoping Study for the Royal Cornwall Museum in Truro; development of the Interpretation Strategy for the Black Cultural Archives in London; and the concept development for the redisplay of the Horniman Museum's Natural History Gallery. I also delivered the Interpretation Strategy for the Olu Obasanjo Presidential Library in Abeokuta, Nigeria.

Since going freelance in 2018 I have worked for museums and heritage sites in the UK. Projects and clients have included delivering the Vision for a new Science and Industry museum for Birmingham Museums Trust; the Interpretation Strategy for Chelsea Physic Garden's glasshouses; the site-wide Interpretation Strategy and new interpretation for Salisbury Cathedral; an experimental project for The National Gallery's Innovation Lab; the Vision for Clandon Park's visitor experience for The National Trust, and new exhibitions and galleries for the Royal Museums Greenwich, The V&A Photography Centre and The Science Museum. In all projects I have worked with project teams with an enormous range of experience and expertise: mentoring and guiding both curators and volunteers through every stage of the project process and enabling them to communicate their research in a manner that is accessible to the widest range of audiences.
